And don't have high expectations for European campgrounds. "There is nothing like a KOA in Europe," said Ron Shardelow of Barry, South Wales, one member of an English RV group touring the U.S. last fall — no showers, no hook-ups, no dump stations. "You carry the loo around with you in an aluminum tube."

But as the Toppings point out, "You have the freedom to go where and when you choose. No closed-in walls can keep you from the fun of exploring exotic places and meeting the people. You are mobile and in charge.
