

2 Daytonians Witnesses In Murder Trial

Two automatic pistols found in possession of the two men on trial in the Topeka, Kans., federal court for slaying a federal agent were purchased at the Niehaus and Dohse sporting goods store here in March and April, it was testified Tuesday by Charles R. Niehaus and Harry K. Shardelow, salesmen at the store.

Summoned by the government, Niehaus and Shardelow identified Glen Applegate, one of the men on trial, as the purchaser of the pistols, one on March 9, the other on April 2, it was reported. On the occasions, Applegate gave his name as "Ramond Sidella" and "Frank Marville," the Dayton salesmen said.

Applegate is on trial with Wimberly W. Baker for the slaying of a G-Man in the Topeka post-office April 16. They have been identified as two of three men who robbed a Katonah, N. Y., bank of \$18,000 March 12, according to dispatches.
